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**The God We Need to Know!**

*God says, "Let those who boast boast in this, that they understand and know me, that I am the LORD; I act with steadfast love, justice, and righteousness in the earth, for in these things I delight, says the LORD." (Jeremiah 9:24)*

Dear Friends,

This is a scary world that we live in; these are uncertain days that we find ourselves living through. Consider the instability and volatility in financial markets from New York to Tokyo. Or the rising fear of terrorism at the hands of such violent groups as Al Qaeda and ISIS or ISIL. In the United States, we are increasingly faced with a plague of violence as evidenced by numerous shootings. Over and beyond all of this, there is a growing anxiety about the earth's climate, producing more extreme and fearful weather patterns. When faced with these enormous challenges, our typical human response is to look for stronger leaders with the wisdom, determination and power to deliver us from our woes. We look for strong candidates with bold solutions for our deep struggles.

**Knowing God humbles our spirit, expands our mind and brings comfort to our soul.**

As understandable as this approach is, I would like to propose another way. Perhaps instead of seeking human solutions to problems of our own making, we would do better to look to God. As we get to know the God revealed in the pages of the Scriptures, we will discover One with the wisdom and power to help us in days of difficulty and stress. At the outset, let me say that I'm not encouraging us to abdicate our responsibility to participate in the democratic process, striving to elect the best people possible, I do believe we must vote and pray for the leaders who are elected. However, I am saying that all people, leaders and citizens, must ultimately depend on God to see us through.

I'm convinced that God is worth getting to know, really know. Many have spent a lifetime studying humanity: our history, the world we live in, how we behave and many other areas. Yet, when times get particularly tough, is that not a time to look to God Who, "Made the heavens and the earth and everything in them"? I believe we need to know God, whose love is steadfast, never failing. All of us have been let down by people: politicians, parents, pastors, professors and so on. But God never fails...we need to know the God who acts with justice, who makes sure in the end that the weak are not mistreated and that the powerful are held accountable for their treatment of the powerless. We need to know the God who is righteous, who is truly good and fair. As we commit ourselves to knowing God in deeper ways we will discover that, to paraphrase C.H. Spurgeon, a great preacher of the 19th century, "our spirits are appropriately humbled, our minds expanded and our souls comforted and encouraged." The God we need to know will see us through these uncertain days!

Ultimately the God we are seeking to know came among us in the person of Jesus Christ. He consistently demonstrated One who is powerful, loving, just and good. Throughout this month we will look to the Old Testament prophets, the ones God used to teach His people about His Being and character. The more I study the God revealed in the Bible, the more encouraged I become. Come to worship this month expecting to grow in your understanding of the God we all need to know, better!

### South Church is Reaching out Through:

**Vacation Bible School** Again, we thank those who worked so hard to bring Vacation Bible School (or Bible Camp) to the kids of our community. Always a wonderful outreach into the community, with music and stories and faith-developing.

**Discussions About The Manchester Shelter** We think that there were close to a dozen people from South Church who went to one of the summer discussions about where MACC goes from here, now that the shelter is closed but the space is still available. Our thanks go out to them. We now await the report on all of this.

**Our Youth Mission Team** Off they went in late July to Pennsylvania for some hard work and good fellowship. We are proud of them.

**Summer Food For MACC Pantry** We put out an emergency request on Sunday mornings and, in response, have been able to deliver a van full of non-perishables so far. Our thanks to all those who contributed. It's never too late by the way; look for sales on soup or cereal or mac and cheese or canned spaghetti... whatever kids, especially, might eat.

**Washington School** The Outreach Committee isn't making a big push for back packs and school supplies this year because it seems like other groups in town are taking care of that, but they will continue our close ties with Washington School and will let you know when they identify some other areas where we can express God's love for these children.

**SUMC Administrative Board Meeting  
May 12, 2015  
Meeting Minutes**

**Opening Prayer/Reading of Vision and Mission Statements:**

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 p.m. by Chairperson Deb Grehn. Pastor John offered an opening prayer and Terry Marshall read the Vision and Mission Statements.

**Acceptance of Outstanding Minutes:**

Draft minutes of the April 14, 2015 meeting were reviewed.

*There was a motion (Bill Hyde, Patti LaForest) to accept the minutes as drafted; all were in favor and the motion carried.*

**Unfinished Business:**

**Church Directory:** Janet Schmidt reported that one planning session has been held. Patti LaForest will be meeting with Jill Smith to ensure we get an accurate membership list for publication in the directory. More research is required to assess whether online access to the directory will be made available. Pastor John requested that a proposal for the photo aspect of the directory be brought to the June meeting of the Administrative Board.

**48 Hartford Road:** Randy Meek, Trustees, provided an update on activities related to the 48 Hartford Road property. Consistent with motions approved at the 6/1/2013 Church Conference, Trustees are moving forward with the sale of this property in the amount of \$525,000 to Walden Behavioral Health. For further information, interested persons can consult the Trustees' minutes.

**Committee Reports:**

**Memorials:** Jane Zadnik reported that \$260 in memorial fund donations have been received in May. Memorial fund donations year-to-date total \$485.

**Staff Parish Relations (SPRC):** Janet Schmidt reported that SPRC is working on the Congregational and Pastoral Evaluations. A staff thank you luncheon was held in April.

**Finance:** Bill Hyde reported that April income was below budget and income year-to-date is \$8,600 below budget. Fortunately, monthly expenses were also below budget and year to date expenses are \$12,000 below budget. We have paid 33.7% of our 2015 Mission Share budget. We remain in a strong cash position due to income that came in at the end of 2014. The group discussed where the proceeds from an IRS refund check in the amount of \$3,532.81 should be posted.

*A motion was made (Randy Meek, Kim Grehn) to deposit the IRS refund into the General Fund. All were in favor and the motion passed.*

**Outreach:** Pastor Dick reported that the Stop Hunger Now and Rebuilding Together events went great, and Mother's Day Blankets have raised over \$2,000 so far. We're in good shape with volunteers for the Washington School Math and Literacy Night. We've met our \$5,000 commitment for the Imagine No Malaria campaign and this means we've saved 500 lives!

Pastor Dick also reported on Social Justice Committee activities. Going forward, meetings of the Social Justice Committee will be at 6:30p.m. on Administrative Board nights (Upper Ed Wing). Representatives of our Committee met with the pastor at New Covenant Church, East Hartford, and also attended the "Color of Justice" program at that church. We're looking into having South Church host an information session and celebration revolving around what's happening in Manchester schools on the topic of Social Justice. Literacy and awareness were acknowledged as key to this issue and the possibility of informative pieces in The Challenge was discussed.

**Trustees:** Randy Meek shared information on affordable housing and other charitable activities of Manchester Interfaith Social Action Committee, including a recent \$25,000 gift to MACC. This organization operates with the support of area churches, including South Church. Randy and Boris and Edith Gerber serve as representatives from South Church.

**Next Generation Ministries:** J.T. Himmelstein reported that spots for the July Harrisburg, PA mission trip are full. Summer activities will kick off with a Bar BQ, June 1. Bible studies will begin June 8. College student care packages have been sent.

Phil Susag shared information about "Hope Acts" in Portland ME, an organization that provides short term residential support for people in need. This type of initiative is Phil's dream for use of properties owned by South Church.

**Finance:** Kim Grehn reported that giving statements have gone out and he plans to send statements on a more frequent basis in the future.

**Education:** Terry Marshall stated that the elevator project has caused some challenges with storage space. Certain space previously used for education will no longer be available and these issues are being worked through. Also, Terry is using temporary office space in the education wing due to the elevator project.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor John reported that nine new Stephen Ministers will be commissioned May 31. We're seeking people who could benefit from the services of a Stephen Minister. Also, the "Building a Christian Community" pledge campaign will end May 31. We lost 50 days on the elevator project, due to the winter weather. Completion is now anticipated for mid-July.

**New Business:**

There was no new business.

**Closing Prayer / Adjournment:**
