Love Came Down


"The Son of Man has come down from heaven..." (John 3:13b)

Dear Friends,

For children, visits with people they don't typically see in their everyday life is one of the most exciting parts of Christmas. When I was a child, my family typically spent Christmas visiting grandparents and loved ones in Michigan. Each year was pretty much identical: seeing our grandparents followed by friends. But one year, we had two special visitors, my uncle and aunt, who flew their tiny single-engine plane from Denver to a small airport in Pontiac, Michigan. What a fun time that was! My uncle had great stories about his younger days with my parents. He took pictures of everyone with his strange box-shaped camera. I'm sure you can remember significant Christmas visits as well.

The Christmas story is filled with accounts of various visits. Gabriel visited first Zechariah and then Mary. He shared unbelievably great news with both. Mary received the wondrous news that she had been divinely chosen to give birth to Jesus, the holy Son of God. (Read Luke 1) After Jesus was born in Bethlehem, he and Mary and Joseph received many visitors that represented the entire socio-economic spectrum. Our infant Lord was first seen by poor shepherds, who returned from the visit, "glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen..." (Read Luke 2). The Magi must have been well off in order to finance an estimated 900-mile journey that took many months and then to give rare and costly "gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh" to Jesus. Of course, if we carefully read the New Testament accounts, we will note the greatest Christmas visitor was Jesus Christ. He who was, and is, God, became human, being born as a baby in Bethlehem. From a divine point of view, the roughly 33-year life of Jesus constituted a visit to humanity. Jesus Christ claimed to be God who had, "come down from heaven..." He came down from heaven as God's ultimate gift of love to all people for all time. He came down to "be lifted up" so that "everyone who believes in him will have eternal life." 
